² The SAF Unit MSO of "Larceny/Fraud" used for forecasting has been divided up into these "sub-MSO" categories so that an offender with multiple larceny/fraud offenses is shown only one time; these categories are hierarchical in nature starting with Fraud, Grand Larceny, Petit Larceny, 3rd or subsequent, and so on as displayed in the table.

Of the 1,085 offenders serving a state-responsible prison sentence for simple possession:

- 35% (378 offenders) had other felony convictions in addition to the possession offense;
- 56% (609 offenders) had served at least one state-responsible prison term in the past;
- 42% (457 offenders) had a total of four or more felony convictions for which they had served prison time (according to their DOC sentence histories);
- 23% (250 offenders) had at least one prior violent felony conviction (as defined in § 17.1-805);
- 49% (534 offenders) were on supervised probation at the time they were sentenced to prison;
- 18% (193 offenders) did not have other felony convictions, had not served a prior SR term of incarceration, had fewer than four felony convictions for which they served prison time and did not have a prior violent felony conviction (§17.1-805) and were not on probation when sentenced to prison

Of the 1,038 offenders serving a State Responsible sentence for a Grand Larceny MSO:

- 68% (707 offenders) had other felony convictions in addition to the grand larceny offense;
- 70% (722 offenders) had served at least one state-responsible prison term in the past;
- 70% (727 offenders) had a total of four or more felony convictions for which they had served prison time (according to their DOC sentence histories);
- 62% (645 offenders) had two or more prior larceny convictions and could have been convicted under §18.2-104, where anyone convicted of a third or subsequent larceny offense would receive a felony conviction;
- 31% (326 offenders) had at least one prior violent felony conviction (as defined in §17.1-805);
- 68% (704 offenders) were on supervised probation at the time they were sentenced to prison;
- 9% (89 offenders) did not have other felony convictions, had not served a prior SR term of incarceration, had fewer than four felony convictions for which they served prison time, did not have a prior violent felony conviction (§17.1-805) and were not on probation when sentenced to prison
